3. New home tutor induction/support

- Home Tutor's link on eLearn Student Portal
- Parent Liaison to include links for online resources in HT induction (already done)
- Recommence HT sessions similar to those that were run in 2019
- Induction booklet (a single source for HT to refer to) currently on Student portal. If you cannot log in you would not be able to access this.
- More activities for HT in Orientation Week (not necessarily run/facilitated by Care Teachers)
- Disparity between school room and home classroom side when implementing provided resources
- Included generic activities for students and HT to complete when starting and at the start of the year for them to get ready for learning and prior to engaging in online tasks
- Virtual Tours to students to see what a home classroom/learning space might look like. Present these in in O week
- One on one walk throughs for new families to Cairns SDE
- Expert videos (ie Screencastomatic) on how to navigate eLearn available in Student Portal
- Work with teacher show have been successful getting families comfortable with our processes to develop more consistent HT-Care Teacher processes
- Provide multiple opportunities for HTs and students to access resources and instructions
- Set up done in previous year during Celebration week
- Need log ins and teachers assigned for new students

Juanita Saal has made some videos of being able to do things, from her 'home screen' which is different to the teacher's screen (what they see – problematic especially for new teachers who may not realise) for beginning of the year Orientation / Orientation for new families. Things like:

- Accessing materials
- Using Blackboard tools
- Where to find forms
- How to's for certain things (log ons)
- Difficulty when home tutors are on a variety of different platforms, when trying to access.

Would be good for each Phase of Learning to develop a resource page on the Student Portal Support Space / Curriculum (maybe have one general, then break out into P-3; 4-6; 7-9; 10-12) as a 'one stop shop' for students / home tutors to head for support.
