Achievement Standards

Music

Students describe and discuss similarities and differences between music they listen to, compose and perform. They discuss how they and others use the elements of music in performance and composition.

Students collaborate to improvise, compose and arrange sound, silence, tempo and volume in music that communicates ideas. They demonstrate aural skills by singing and playing instruments with accurate pitch, rhythm and expression.

Visual arts

Students describe and discuss similarities and differences between artworks they make, present and view. They discuss how they and others use visual conventions in artworks.

Students collaborate to plan and make artworks that are inspired by artworks they experience. They use visual conventions, techniques and processes to communicate their ideas.

Assessable Elements

An overall level of achievement in this subject is determined by the teacher's on-balance judgment of the evidence presented in students' summative assessment across the following:

- Making includes learning about and using knowledge, skills, techniques, processes, materials and technologies to explore arts practices and make artworks that communicate ideas and intentions.
- Responding includes exploring, responding to, analysing and interpreting artworks.

Semester 2	Term 3	<p>Visual Arts Print art Students will focus on the elements and principles of design, different forms and techniques and will respond to artworks.</p>
		<p>Summative Assessment: The final assessment: Students create visual artworks using a range of artists as inspiration for their own artwork. They use and experiment with different materials, techniques (block printing, stencilling) and visual conventions (colour, texture, contrast, emphasis) in planning and making their artworks; Students describe artworks they make and view; they discuss how they and others use visual conventions in artworks. They present their artwork using a suitable format.</p>
